Why spay & neuter?

Here are some important reasons:

Spaying your pet prevents the occurrence of pyometra (infected uterus) and ovarian cancer.

Neutering your pet at an appropriate age will prevent unwanted marking, aggressive behaviors, & testicular and prostate cancer.

Be sure to stop by to register your animals at the Veterinary Treatment Facility during in-processing!

Prevention is Key

It is always better to stop parasites before they cause a problem for your pet. Having your pet on the appropriate preventatives will save you time and money, not to mention valuable years with your pet.

Parasites come in many forms, such as intestinal worms, heartworms, protozoa, fleas, ticks, & mites.

Did you know?

According to the American Heartworm Society, the average cost of heartworm treatment is anywhere from \$1,200 to \$1,800*. You can prevent this costly pest with \$70 to \$200 worth of preventatives per year. These often protect against other parasites, as well.
